
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Overview of New Health Coverage for Adults

- Beginning January 1, 2019
- Application opens November 1, 2018
- Approximately 400,000 more Virginia adults will enroll in quality, low-cost health coverage
- MAGI Eligibility Criteria no assets, 65% ex parte for renewals
- Automated (GAP, Planned First) and expedited (SNAP) eligibility determination
- Federal Marketplace to determine eligibility for MAGI cases

Application Paths

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Local Department of Social Services (LDSS) Online Application Portal (Common Help)

Local Investment

- or the equivalent of 200 new level eligibility workers
- Funding for the equivalent of 300 new local eligibility workers
- Estimated New ME dollars for LDSS in FY 2019 = \$21.5 million and FY 2020 = \$21.5 million
- Federal & State Share = \$18.2 million
- Local Share = \$3.3 million (to be paid by state office in FY 2019)
- Laptops for all new local workers
- Investments in network and infrastructure



1115 Waiver

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- DRAFT Waiver released today for 30 day public comment
- Submit waiver to CMS by November 4
- Once certified complete by CMS, 30 day federal comment period
- Work and Community Engagement Requirements
 - Timing
 - Employment supports
- Premiums, Co-Pays, and Health and Wellness Accounts
